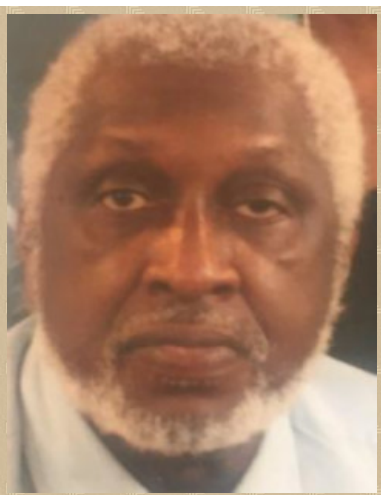


Deacon William Robert Wright
